Meeting

This month's circuits include 3 books of British North America, 2 books of France and 2 classical Europe. There are four topical books which include; 2 nautical topics, including ship covers; sports and religious icons. The rest are an assortment of U.S. stamps.

A while back Bill mentioned an article in the APS journal on using a black light for detecting watermarks. I thought we would take a look at that at this month's meeting and see if it really works. And, while we are there we might also take another look at tagging. It has been awhile since we looked at that.

Thoughts while reading Linn's and other stamp publications

While reading through Linn's the other day a couple of things caught my attention and prompted some thought and a second look.

First, at the last meeting we discussed the \$9.5 million sale of the Magenta 1c British Guiana stamp. But, Sotheby's reports that all of the lots sold, exceeding their estimate. There may be fewer collectors, but there is still a great demand for good quality material.

Secondly, Linn's mentioned that the 1958 booklet of 4c Abraham Lincoln stamps cataloged at \$150. This prompted me to take another look at my small booklet collection. I do not really focus on booklet, but I have bought several collections over the years that have had booklets in them. Also I have sold many of them, sometimes at face value. Did I miss something by not really paying attention?

Linn's also had a piece about the 13c Washington Crossing the Delaware. It seems that there can be an error in two of the stamps. The value is printed upside down. I have several copies of this sheet and several individual stamps from it. I need to go back and take a look at these again. Sometimes things just don't register with me. Did I miss something there? I have often said that if I had been William Roby I would probably handed the sheet back to the clerk and said these stamps are defective, please see if you have a better sheet.

Speaking of Jennies, I understand that there have only been 15 of the 2013 upright Jennies found so far. I guess the three I have would make 18. I haven't opened the packages for mine yet though. Would they be worth more if they are in the original unopened package?
